

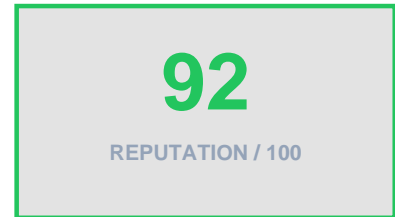

Power-words vs. Substance ratio.

Information density is exceptionally high, favoring specific nouns and dates over marketing adjectives. Headings like 'Expositions en cours' lead directly to substantive dates (March 18, 2026 - July 19, 2026) and named artists (Gustave Courbet, Annette Messager). The body text includes granular details such as '36,000 sheets' in the graphics department and specific location markers like 'Galerie Tuck' and 'Salle 21'. There is almost zero 'fluff' saturation in the heading hierarchy.

## SEMANTIC COHERENCE

Homepage promise vs. Sub-page reality.

There is no detectable semantic drift between the homepage and sub-pages. The homepage establishes a clear tripartite signal of Expositions, Agenda, and Collections, all of which are delivered with increasing specificity on their respective pages. For example, the homepage H2 'Expositions' is mirrored on the sub-page with 'Expositions en cours' and 'Prochainement,' featuring identical dates and branding.

## TRUST & PROOF

Verifiable evidence vs. Trust Theatre.

### DIAGNOSIS: TRUST THEATRE

The site avoids trust theatre entirely, with a review\_count of 0 and no deceptive trust badges. It relies on institutional authority rather than social proof carousels. Proof links are replaced by functional utility, such as a downloadable PDF 'Agenda culturel mars-août 2026' and direct booking links for workshops.

### EVIDENCE: PROOF DENSITY

The proof density is high, with a ratio heavily favoring verifiable facts over assertions. Every mentioned event includes a date, a time, a specific price (e.g., 10/8 ?), and a target audience ('Baby visite 12/24 mois'). The mention of '36,000 sheets' in the Cabinet des arts graphiques provides a quantitative measure of the collection's substance.

## COMMODITY FINGERPRINT

Detection of industry cliches/templates.

The site avoids generic value propositions like 'unforgettable experiences.' Instead, it uses industry-standard taxonomy ('Cabinet des arts graphiques', 'Exposition temporaire'). While it uses some standard museum navigation patterns, the content is uniquely tied to the building's architect (Charles Girault) and its specific 1900 World Fair origin, making the copy impossible to transplant to a competitor.

## IDENTITY & AUTHORITY

Expert verifiability & Schema depth.

### DIAGNOSIS: AUTHORITY GAPS

The primary source of the score comes from a technical authority gap rather than content BS. The site lacks structured JSON-LD data (schema\_json is null), and key pages like the Homepage and Expositions landing page are missing H1 tags, which creates a minor disconnect between its cultural status and technical execution. However, named experts and artists are verified through historical context in the body text.

### EVIDENCE: PERFORMANCE VS. CLAIMS

There is no disconnect between marketing tone and delivered substance. The site makes very few 'claims' other than the availability of art, which it proves through a detailed programming calendar and inventory descriptions. The tone is descriptive and archival rather than promotional.
